Declaration of Rights	Declaration of Rights William and Mary signed the Declaration of Rights when they became King and Queen. It was an important piece of paper that said parliament could make laws and guide the King and Queen.
Parliament	A group of people chosen to represent the people who live in a country and make decisions for them.
Election	The occasion when people choose who they would like to be in parliament.
Prime Minister	The leader of the government.
Government	The group of people who make up the leading party in the parliament.
Party	A group of people who work together to gain power in parliament.
Vote	A choice, marked on a piece of paper with a cross.
Budget	The government's plan to spend money on things the country needs.
Services	Things that the government provide for the country, such as schools, hospitals, the police force, and the fire service.
