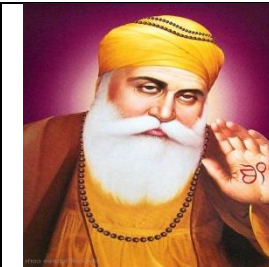

Widow who gave her last two coins (Christianity)



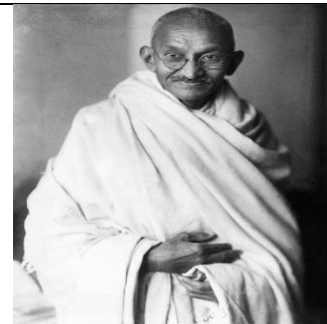
Martin Luther King

- American Baptist minister and activist.
- Involved in the civil rights movement.
- Gave the 'I have a dream' speech.
- Inspired by the non-violent protest by Gandhi.



Rosa Parks

- American activist in the civil rights movement.
- Called 'the first lady of civil rights' and 'the mother of freedom'.
- Refused to give her seat up for a white man.
- Her actions resulted in a bus boycott.



Ghandi

- Leader of the Indian independence movement against British colonial rule.
- Non-violent motives.
- Known as the 'Father of the Nation'.
- Famous for his hunger strikes in protest.



Anne Frank

- German born Jewish diarist.
- Victim of the Holocaust.
- Lived most of her life in Amsterdam.
- Went into hiding in some concealed rooms behind a bookcase in her father's workplace.



Mother Teresa

- Nun and missionary.
- Lived most of her life in India.
- Founded the missionaries of charity.
- Worked with the homeless, ill, orphans and others in need.
