Compulsory homework:

You may choose how you present each piece, you may take plain or lined paper home from school if you need to.

Tasks:

Research Dorothy Hodgkin and choose how to present your information. For example, a biography, a timeline of his life, a leaflet etc.	Redesign the front cover of the book 'Holes'. Think about the themes of the story that you will want displayed on the front. How imaginative can you be?	Create a crossword with words related to our science topic 'Light, Earth and Space'. For example planet, orbit, ultraviolet and darkness. Remember to write clues for each word.
Look at the inventions created during the Industrial revolution. Draw a picture or make a model of one and discuss how it worked.	Watch a new film and write a detailed film review. Include a brief summary of the plot and main characters, explain the genre of the film, and tell us whether you would recommend it and why.	Conduct a survey at home to find out the most popular Christmas song. You can have up to 6 categories. After collecting your information, present it in a correctly labelled bar graph.
If you could create a new invention, what would it be? Draw designs for your invention and mind map about it. What materials would you use? What would its purpose be? Who would use it? Where would it be sold?	What does Christmas mean to you? You can choose how to present your work. It could be a picture, a poem, food you have made or a model.	Visit somewhere you haven't been before and use a map to find your way there, or to find your way around the place. Take a picture of you using the map, or bring the map in to share with us.
